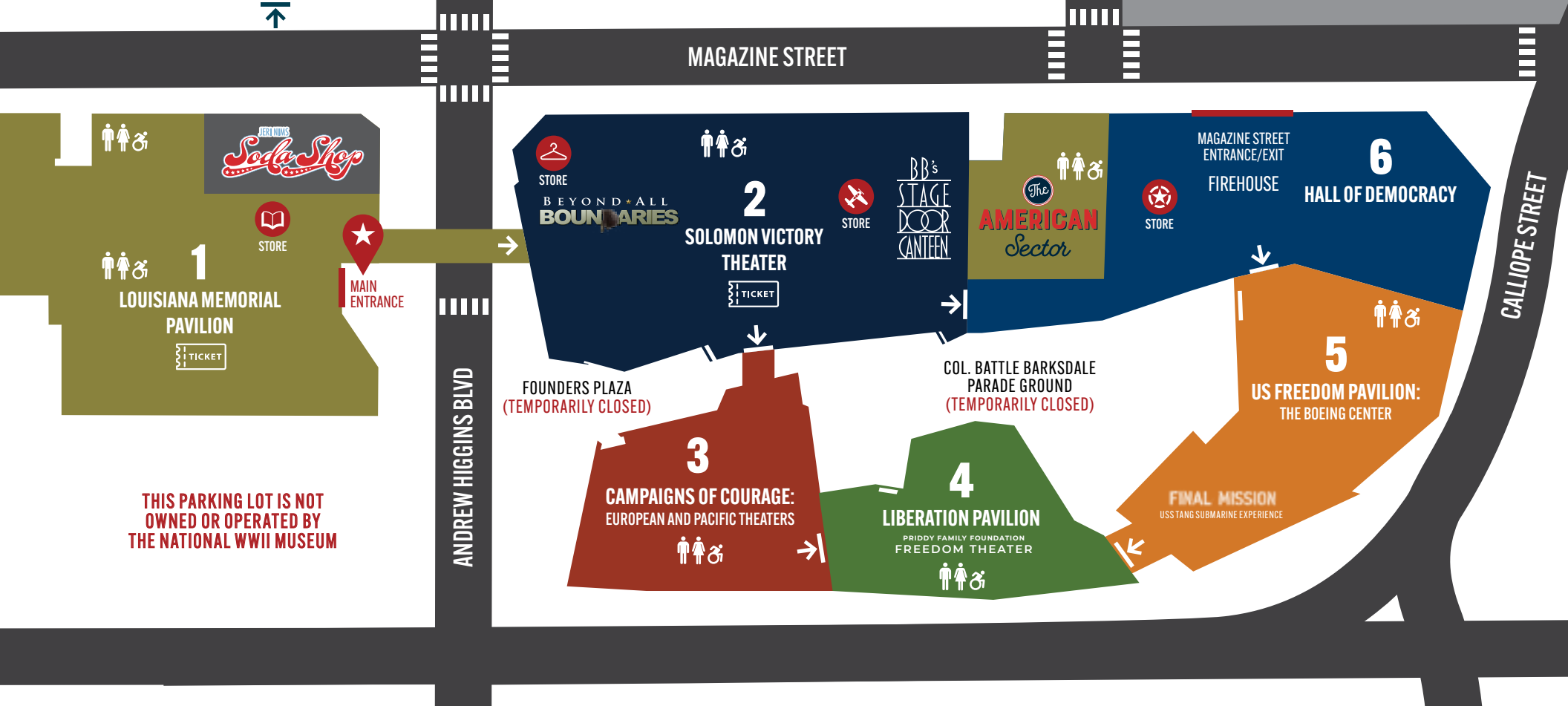

The Arsenal of Democracy:

The Herman and George R. Brown Salute to the Home Front LEVEL 2

The Arsenal of Democracy exhibit tells the story of America's road to war, why World War II was fought, and the important efforts on the Home Front. Through nine immersive galleries, visitors experience this chapter of history through personal narratives, evocative artifacts, and immersive environments that highlight WWII-era American life.



Malcolm S. Forbes Rare and Iconic Artifacts Gallery LEVEL 1

This gallery includes more than 50 artifacts that give fascinating insight into different perspectives of the war effort. It is also home to *Voices from the Front*, a new interactive experience that allows guests to hold conversations with more than a dozen members of the WWII generation.

The first floor honors the sacrifices of the WWII generation and explores the immense cost of the war with exhibits on the Holocaust, Anne Frank, faith in wartime, and the Monuments Men and Women.



Golding Family Foundation and Woldenberg Foundation *Forces of Freedom at Home and Abroad (1945–Present)* LEVEL 2

The second floor explores the war's impact in the postwar period and its lasting legacies today. Exhibits examine the rebuilding efforts of a world destroyed, the war crimes trials, the emergence of the United States as a world "superpower," movements for social change and civil rights, new technological innovations, and the war's impact on foreign policy.

HALL OF DEMOCRACY

Hall of Democracy is the home of the Museum's Jenny Craig Institute for the Study of War and Democracy and WWII Media and Education Center. Some of the sprawling pavilion's features include a fully equipped media auditorium, a special exhibition hall, an education classroom, and a Museum Store. The complex serves as a hub for disseminating WWII knowledge through online access to Museum initiatives, products, distance-learning activities, and digital programs.



The Senator John Alario, Jr. Special Exhibition Hall LEVEL 1

Located on the first level of Hall of Democracy, this hall is dedicated to featuring full-scale traveling and institution-produced special exhibits, including those focused on lesser-known stories from the war.

STEM Innovation Gallery

This gallery features hands-on experiments and authentic WWII-era macro-artifacts to show how science, technology, engineering, and math contributed to—and advanced—the Allied effort during World War II.

WWII Motor Pool

The restoration and preservation of the Museum's priceless collection of WWII macro-artifacts is performed by staff and volunteers, in full view of the public—with an observation space providing a unique peek into the maintenance of WWII-era vehicles and other artifacts.

This pavilion includes a private nursing/quiet room as well as a restroom with an adult changing table. These facilities are available to all Museum guests. Please knock before entering.

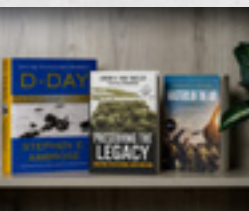
